SPEAKER: Annika and Philippa: KARIS Support Society

- Philippa: Karis support society: non profit for recovery focus programming to women and women with children who have experienced trauma abuse that have led to addiction or substance abuse
- Long term sobriety and metal health is a world wide problem
- Supportive housing, Long term support
- 3 stages: 8-12 months support, semi-independent living, and after support
- Offers a place for women with children to go, that way they can keep their children with them instead of the kids ending up in the foster care system.
- Program runs Monday to Thursday: relapse prevention, self esteem, building boundaries, life transition courses
- They works with a number of partners that come in with funding but offer support to the KARIS ladies
- Over 350 women and children have found support through Karis
- Karis makes sure they support their women with housing when they leave
- Karis helps women keep or regain custody of their children
- 80% of women in the aftercare programs are now employed
- Annika: specialized in horse assisted therapy and the goal is to get them to work with Karis to offer therapy options to the Karis women.
- She is from Germany and has a vaste education in therapy and life coaching, her love of horses and experience as a dressage coach led her to be a horse assisted therapist
- Annika wants to work with Karis because she believes in community based partnerships and wants to reach out to the people that are most in need of her services and could not otherwise afford them or even know they exist
- She partners with UBCO as well for research in the field
- Horses are a great therapy tool because horses create a non-judgmental environment.
- Working outdoors is also great
- Working with horses allows for a triangular relationship between patienttherapist-horse. Makes it easier to feel confortable
- Horses are great at providing feedback on the emotions and tensions they feel in a person
- Horses are non-verbal and can help greatly in increasing the non verbal human awareness
- Helps align intention to action
- There are proven effects on mental health and depression
- She works with Now Canada women and they come out for a session once a week and would like to do the same with KARIS
- Facilities are in Ellison

• Karis gets their main support from private funds since its creation in 2006 but now need some more support
