Doug was the high school basketball coach for over 40 years Jeff Tubbs is the school basketball captain Ken Hart

#### **Presentation:**

- The Basketball Society is a non profit
- Mission is to provide an opportunity for more men and women to excel at a sport they love while pursuing an education at Okanagan College
- They believe there is a huge void in the Kelowna Basketball community.
- Their Program is partnered with Okanagan College, but not funded by OC
- Motivated to motivate our youth
- Vision: develop a culture and give every one the opportunity to thrive
- The program is attracting more people to OK College
- Okanagan College Basketball Society wants Rotary as one of their main sponsors while introducing players to Rotary and showing them the benefits of getting involved.
- OK College is now bringing back college sports
- They do not have facilities to practice and need to rent out gyms to practice
- The youth programs are very popular.
- Jeff spoke as to why he thinks this program is different: They are having to go out in the community and ask for supporters and it makes them more a part of the community. Each player has to raise \$1500 to be on the team.
- They are independent from the college but operate in the college league.
- They need support from people like us to help spread the word and give the athletes a chance.
