SPEAKER: Mandy Glinsbockel – Board Director for Her International

• Mission: empowering women and girls through education.

- Mandy spent 6 months working in Nepal and when she returned she was seeking local charities that empowered women. She has now been on the board for over 2 years
- Her International has been chartered in Canada for 13 Years. Founded in 2005
- Charity models are starting to shift and Her International empowers the women in their programs to also give back their time and mentor others which empowers them even further.
- They partner with local organizations on the ground in Nepal that are very knowledgeable about the specific needs of the local people. This helps integrate and assures that the monitoring is done properly.
- The partner with Hope Outreach and Karis here in Kelowna.
- They have a few different programs: Empowerment through education (primary girls scholarships), Bicycle program, Hero Girls (adolescent girls leadership course), Microfinance and life skills group.
- The life skills groups teach skills around domestic violence awareness, micro finance, literacy, numeracy, etc.
- Illiteracy rate is very high in Nepal. Teaching them to read and write increases their self-confidence and self-worth.
- They also have a social enterprise called UNAKO, which means HER in Nepalese. They sell scarves and jewelry at local markets etc. They teach women how to make them and then sell them. All proceeds go back into the program.
- The Local Canada programs: the run local empowering workshops for adolescent girls. They also run an event called Hope In Her Eyes, a gala at the Laurel Packing house.
- Upcoming event: Nine Wine and Pie, a gold tournament at Sunset Ranch on September 20th. 9 holes of golf followed by wine tasting. They have a \$25,000 goal for this year. This would send 83 girls to school. Contact <u>kevin@edgeconbebuilders.com</u>

• Education in Nepal not free even in government schools. Governments schools do not teach English which then limits the opportunities. Cost of government school is about \$500 per year per student.
