GUEST SPEAKER – The Venerable Christine Ross – Caring for the Homeless

- Deacon Christine Ross is the Minister of Community Outreach for St Andrews. She has been at St Andrews Parish for more than 20 years. She gave us a down to earth overview of the homeless situation in Kelowna and how St Andrews Parish is partnering with other agencies in Kelowna to transition and help the homeless.
- There are approximately 447 legitimate homeless persons living in Kelowna (transients excluded) who survive by "couch surfing" and living on the streets. It is estimated that 33% suffer from addictions, 34% are homeless for economic reasons and the remaining 33% are on the streets by choice, abusive relationships and family conflict (kicked out the home)
- St Andrews Parish works closely with NOW (New Opportunities for Woman) whose original mandate was to help sex trade workers and has now expanded to provide safe accommodations for women who have/are suffering in abusive relationships. Canadian Mental Health Association who operate Willowbidge Transition House for men and the Boys and Girls Club who assist in emergency care for youth who have left home for various reasons.
- The main focus of the Parish and the partnering organizations is to assist the people at risk transition productively back into the community and provide accommodation until such time as they can venture out on their own and become fully independent.
- They provide "start up kits" containing basic essentials for women and their children who find themselves kicked out of their homes with little else but clothing on their backs. Similar for men.
- In addition they provide a container with home furnishings and small appliances to help people in transition re-establish into new accommodations. All items are brand new and the approximate costs is \$900.00.
